We offer courses in Child Development in KS4, and Health & Social Care in KS5. Both are in the form of vocational qualifications which are the equivalent to GCSEs and A levels.

In Years 10 & 11 we study OCR Cambridge National in Child Development. This is a nationally recognised qualification designed to provide students with a choice of routes into further education or employment and is the equivalent to a GCSE. This qualification is modular and is split into three units. One is an externally assessed exam worth 40% and the other two are internally assessed assignments worth 30% each. This qualification will be awarded on the scale of Level 1 Pass to Distinction (equivalent of up to grade 3 at GCSE) and Level 2 Pass to Distinction* (equivalent to GCSE grade 4 upwards).

In Years 12 & 13 we currently follow OCR Cambridge Technical Extended Certificate in Health & Social Care, which is the equivalent to one A level. Again, this is a modular course, with a combination of external exams and internally assessed work, and is awarded as a Pass, Merit or Distinction, equivalent to grades E, C and A at A level. It is possible to follow this course for one year only and to gain a Certificate in Health & Social Care, which carries the same UCAS points as an AS level. In September 2025, the new Y12 cohort will be starting the new OCR Level 3 Alternative Academic Qualification Cambridge Advanced National in Health and Social Care. There is a slightly different course structure and content, but the grading system remains as above.

Both courses are appropriate not just for student's considering a future career in health, social care or early years' provision, but for anyone considering a public facing role such as the police force or teaching, where effective communication skills, and a knowledge of safeguarding and a person-centred approach are also useful, if not vital. Some of the chosen careers and further courses of study for our students include nursing, paramedic, physiotherapy, occupational health, social work, nursery teacher and teaching.
