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Music is a universal language that embodies one of the highest forms of creativity. We aim to engage and inspire pupils to develop a love of music and their talent as musicians, and so increase their self-confidence, creativity and sense of achievement. As our students progress, they should develop a critical engagement with music, allowing them to compose, and to listen with discrimination to the best in the musical canon.

During Years 7 to 9 all students study music for one lesson a week. They learn to apply theory both practically and through different forms of notation. They are given the opportunity to use a variety of resources including iMac computers, keyboards, ukuleles, drum kits, guitar, djembe drums and other percussion. Students work in groups, pairs and individually. There are a wide variety of clubs including Choir, Concert Band, Rock School, Ukulele/Guitar Club. Students can also learn one or more instruments with our peripatetic instrumental teachers on flute, clarinet, saxophone, voice, piano, brass, violin, 'cello and guitar.
