# <u>Diphtheria, Tetanus, Inactivated Polio Vaccine (Td/IPV) and</u> <u>Meningococcal Groups ACWY Vaccine (MenACWY) Immunisation</u> for Teenagers in Year 9

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Diphtheria, Tetanus, Inactivated Polio Vaccine and Meningococcal Groups ACWY (DTP/MenACWY) Vaccine is available to all young people in Year 9.

Your child's DTP/MenACWY vaccine is now due. It is important that you consent or decline the vaccinations as soon as possible. Please ensure that you tick both boxes as you are consenting or declining for two separate vaccinations.

A failure to do this will result in further contact from the Immunisation Team to ensure that you have received the offer of the vaccination.

#### **Giving Consent**

This link will close at midday on the working day before the team is due to visit so please complete this as soon as possible as the team will be unable to take any consents after this point. This is a school-based programme and can be accessed via your child's school session or via our community clinics. If you wish to attend with your child, please submit a consent form and include in the additional information that you do not wish your child to be vaccinated at school but would like an appointment at one of our community clinics. Following submission please contact the team to arrange an appointment on 0300 421 8140. Your child's school will inform you of the date planned for our team to visit.

We recommend that you discuss your vaccination choice with your son or daughter.



## Students at secondary school

If we do not receive the completed decision form, each young person may be assessed on an individual basis and invited to self-consent for the vaccination, providing they can demonstrate an understanding of the vaccination being given. This is in-line with the Gillick competency and consent to treatment guidance which can be found at Consent to treatment - Children and young people - NHS (www.nhs.uk)
