

INFORMATION FOR TEACHERS

All teachers should embed careers into the curriculum so students can understand how their learning relates to their future. For example, STEM subjects can lead to a wide range of future career paths and STEM teachers should therefore highlight the relevance of their subjects during lesson time.

Our main objective is to:

- Have a prominent careers board in every department which links learning and skill development to different careers.
- Further develop links with businesses and organisations.
- Continue to invite alumni and other external speakers to come into school (virtual talks also acceptable).
- Where possible, and appropriate, organise external visits by students to local businesses/organisations.
- Where possible, with existing school trips within the curriculum, bring the focus to a 'workplace visit' as well as it being an educational trip.
- Have a whole school 'Careers Day' where all teachers start their lessons with a focus on careers. For example, they could talk about their own career pathway or how a range of skills they may have learnt doing another task led to how they work today.
- Challenge stereotypes by considering the interests and needs of all students regardless of disability or gender.
