
## **KS5 Students guide to Microsoft Teams**


### What is Teams and how do you sign in?

- 1. Teachers will use **Teams** to connect with you via video if the school is told to close or a year group is sent home.
- 2. Go to **Office.com** and sign in (school email + password).
- 3. Select the **Teams** icon. You have already been set up with a **Team** for each of your classes.



## Using the Teams toolbar during a live session

- 1. You can turn your camera on and off.
- 2. You can mute/unmute your microphone.
- 3. You can ask your teacher questions in the chat box.
- 4. You can 'raise your hand' to ask a question.
- 5. You can leave the meeting by hanging up.



#### How often will I have a 'live' session?

- You can expect to have 2 live sessions each week for each of your subjects.
- Work will be set through Show My Homework for your other scheduled lessons.

### Finding out when your live sessions will happen.



- 1. Select your calendar in Teams.
- 2. You will see all scheduled live sessions in your calendar.
- 3. From calendar, click a session and then Join when it's time to start.
- 4. Adjust your audio and video settings, then click Join Now.
- 5. You can also join a meeting from the **General Channel** in each of your class teams.
- 6. A recording of the session will be placed into the **General Channel**. You can view this at any time.
