Introduction

This annual report summarises the impact and progress of development of the library. Focusing mainly on a six month period. In this time the library has:

- Reorganised the library shelving from alphabetical organisation of books to genrefication.
- Implemented a new LMS and catalogued library collection onto new library management system.
- · Designed and rolled out a library website to students and parents.
- · Planned and hosted a programme of library events, clubs and author workshops.
- Launched a weekly library newsletter.
- · Enrolled and trained student librarians.
- Fundraised to improve our book collection.
- Increased inclusive and diverse titles.
- Taken part in a county wide Readathon to raise money for charity.
- · Created and maintained a welcoming and inclusive atmosphere.
- · Collaborated with other Gloucestershire schools as part of the Year of Reading.



The new library management system has enabled us to report and analyse data that was previously unavailable. It shows that our author visits and events programme have had a huge impact on students' enthusiasm to read. It also highlights the importance of the library stocking the latest book releases, capitalising on the buzz around popular titles.




Monthly Book Loans

Each event brings new students into the library who hadn't visited previously. It has been interesting and encouraging to see that PP students are steadily increasing their library usage. Importantly, our aims of ensuring the library is a welcoming, accessible and inclusive space is vital, with 45.9% of library users having special educational needs.
