



# Introduction

This annual report summarises the impact and progress of development of the library. Focusing on a six month period. In this time the library has:

- Calendar of curriculum linked library events
- Introduced monthly print magazines
- Launched any book book club
- Record breaking Readathon: 13,685 minutes tracked!
- Introduced new tradition of Jólabókaflóðið! (Yule book flood)
- Introduced SEN friendly lunch break (silent book club)
- Won a £500 grant from Tesco's stronger starts scheme.
- Provided free £1 book tokens and free books as part of our World Book Day celebrations.
- Hosted a book fair – earning over £315 worth of free books
- Y7 Author event with Claire Hatcher-Smith, kindly funded by Farshore publishing.
- Y10 Virtual Author event with Josh Silver & Louisa Reid, courtesy of ReadforGood
- Partnered with The Reading Agency to provide book clubs
- Won The Reading Agency's World Oceans Day display competition – a signed first edition of David Attenborough's new book.




# Circulation data

Monthly book loans 24/25




Book Loans
