



PE Information, September 2026 – new students.

Hello everyone.

The PE Department are very much looking forward to a new year of PE and Sport at Farmor's. PE is often a subject that is eagerly anticipated or carries some level of uncertainty and concern. We are conscious of this and work very hard so that all students feel comfortable and enjoy PE as well as offer many opportunities for those wishing to fully immerse themselves in school sport.

At KS3, students have 2 lessons each week and will be placed in Group 1 (Girls Performance); Group 2 (Boys Performance) or Group 3 (Mixed Activity)

If you look at your child's timetable it will have a class code of something like 7x/PE2.

The number at the end corresponds to the group they are in.

Currently the activities being taught are

	1 st lesson of week	2 nd lesson of week
Group 1- Girls Performance	Netball	Gymnastics (Flight)
Group 2 - Boys Performance	Rugby	Basketball
Group 2 - Mixed Activity	Badminton	Tag Rugby

As we move through the year, they will change activities and we will let you know these nearer the time.

We also wanted to offer a few reminders and responses to some FAQ's we have recently received.

1: Kit – Since COVID, we have retained the rule that students are able to wear their PE Kit to school on a day on which they either have a PE Lesson, PE club at lunchtime or fixture after school. This has led to far greater teaching time in lessons, fewer incidents in the changing room and enables smooth transitions to club and fixtures.

One downside is that if it rains during the lesson the kit can get wet/muddy. We minimise this if we know the weather is coming and also encourage students to pack a small hand towel and bring their tracksuits so that they can put these back on after the lesson so that they are warm and dry for the remainder of the day. Tracksuits are removed for the PE lesson itself and then become a uniform item for the rest of the day (or students can stay in shorts if it is warm enough).

We know this will take a bit of getting used to and will support the students with this in the early weeks of Y7. We do have some spare kit for those who forget but this can be embarrassing for them to need to change and may not always be a perfect fit so please support your child by ensuring they have the right kit on the right days.

We understand there have been some issues with the new kit orders – we will be flexible and supportive whilst this is sorted.

Nike Air Force Ones or similar are not permitted in PE – Students should wear trainers/running shoes that offer appropriate comfort and protection. **All** jewellery must be removed for PE on grounds of Health& Safety.

Where Rugby and Hockey are on the timetable, gum shields are recommended but not compulsory. However, anyone selected for school matches **must** have a gum shield. The same applies to shin pads for Football and Hockey. Group 3 students doing Tag Rugby will not need gum shields.

Boots are required for Football and Rugby lessons on the field. Most students will have them, but I appreciate this is an expense for some families for an item that might not frequently be used out of school. We do have some spares so if boots are an issue please contact us and we will try to help. Where students have outgrown boots, we will happily receive donations of unwanted items or can offer a 'trade' for a pair of our spares in a size that fits.

2: Injuries - The students are our responsibility when they are timetabled for PE and are expected to attend all lessons other than exceptional medical circumstances that would have been agreed with the Head of Year. If your child is injured, the expectation is that they still attend the lesson in their kit and that we will give them differentiated tasks to attempt or a role as a coach/official so that they are still engaged in the lesson and the learning process. There is no standing on the side in uniform or going to sit in the library.

If your child is injured, the old-fashioned note from the parent is still required since we cannot guarantee that we will see emails before lessons. The note needs to give some details about the injury so that we know what we can ask of the students without risking any discomfort or further injury. We will also discuss this with the student.

3: Clubs/Fixtures – [2026-27 Autumn PE Clubs](#)

Our PE Clubs take place during lunchtimes, and the vast majority of our matches are after school on Tuesdays/Wednesdays/Thursdays. All students are welcome to attend our clubs and regular, consistent attendance at these is required to be considered for selection in fixtures. On days when they attend a club at lunchtime, we encourage students to bring a packed lunch or eat the majority of their lunch during breaktime.

We are working on the fixtures for this term and will publish these once complete. We are exploring the use of Edulink to share specific fixture information, but students are encouraged to be responsible for checking team sheets that also show relevant information. Parents are only allowed to spectate fixtures that take place at Farmor's outside of school hours (so from 3:30pm onwards). In cases where fixtures start before that time, we cannot permit spectators on grounds of Safeguarding. Most other schools have the same policy.

Where fixtures are competitive, we are selective, but we also try to arrange multiple friendlies to ensure those who commit to clubs but are not always selected will get an opportunity to represent us at some stage. We also run an array of House Matches that enables in school competition.
