Teaching & Learning:

All years - Read2Learn, Modern Foreign Languages: In Modern Languages knowledge of chunks of language, as opposed to just individual words, help us have a better and more confident understanding of complex sentences. Naturally, we won't always understand what every word means and that can knock our confidence. Each Sentence Builder has five lessons. Lesson 3 of 5 explicitly looks at reading. A complex text is studied. Students hear it from the teacher. Teachers encourage fluency by reading quietly, quickly, slowly or reading internally encouraging students to guess where they are. Students then choral repeat sections and practice in pairs before answering questions on the text. Students may then adapt text to produce their own model. At Farmor's all students use their Sentence Builder booklets to read, understand and problem solve. Our goal is to promote fluency, long-term retention, and communicative competence.
