
## Parent Bulletin



## 16th May 2025 Week A

All years: Read to Learn - This week we hear from Mrs Parker-Woolway our Head of Art. In Art and Textiles we have been focusing on two areas with our disciplinary reading. At KS3 we have been using a range of text to introduce areas of research to students that link to their current projects. Through comprehension style tasks, research has introduced students to subject specific language and encourages a greater depth of understanding of historical and cultural contextual issues. With KS4 we have been focusing on reading and deepening our understanding of the assessment criteria used on the course and how it applies to individual student work. It is hoped that by closely reading and understanding how they are assessed in art, our students will be able to improve their work.

**Year 11 - English Department revision sessions:** We will be running revision sessions ahead of the English Language Paper 2 (Friday 6<sup>th</sup> of June). We would like as many students to attend as possible, particularly as there will have been a long gap between the previous paper and a half term holiday in between! Sessions will be run by your child's English teacher in their usual teaching room. The planned sessions will be at the following times.

Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> June Period 3:

This is not a regular lesson slot, but students will be fresh from a Maths exam. Students should have break as usual then head to English.

Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> June:

Miss Hatton's, Ms Kelly's, Mrs Palmer's/Ms Simmonds' and Ms Fisher's classes: Period 2 (10.10) - This is a normal lesson slot.

Mr Smith's, Mrs Futtu's, Ms Simmonds and Mr Bew's classes Period 5 (2.25) - this is a normal lesson slot.

Attendance at these sessions is optional, but we would strongly recommend that your child attend for reminders and tips ahead of the exam on Friday morning. A reminder will be sent to students on Satchel One from their English teacher over the half term holiday.

GCSE Drama Trip - North By Northwest: Just a reminder that your child is going on the GCSE Drama trip to see the Wise Children Theatre Company's production of North By Northwest at the Everyman Theatre Cheltenham on the evening of Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> June. The students need to be at Farmor's School for a 6.00pm departure on the minibus. We will meet outside Student Services. If any students need to arrive early, they are welcome to join me in the Drama department. I appreciate that the students will have been at their Work Experience placement, so there is no need for them to wear school uniform. They may not have had much time to eat so please provide them with a packed dinner if they need one. The students may bring the means to buy a programme or refreshments at the theatre if they would like to. I shall provide the students with the resources they need to make notes with.
