All years - Read to Learn: As a school we are constantly thinking about how we can improve our teaching to ensure your children get the best possible chances in life. One area we have focused on this year is teaching our students explicitly how to read in each subject discipline. Reading in Maths, for example, looks quite different from reading in English. Each week we will publish an account from a Head of Department to explain their subject specific approach to reading. Mrs Wells

We are starting this week with Maths and an account from our Head of Maths, Mrs Lines: In Maths we have been focussing on how to approach 'wordy' questions. We are encouraging students to read the question carefully, identify the scenario and key information, and then think about what the question is asking them to do. Students are then being shown how to set their solution out in a logical manner, using sufficient words to explain their thought processes clearly, rather than just putting calculations and answers, and finally to make sure that they fully answer the question, including any units.
