We like our students to have excellent facilities at Farmor's. When the new toilets were built 7 years ago to replace some really poor facilities, all urinals were taken out of the boy's toilets and all students now have the privacy of a toilet in a stall with a ceiling length door. CCTV was introduced in the walkways around the entrances to toilets to hopefully catch any student damaging the new toilets.

Last term there were occasions when several toilets were out of order for weeks due to wilful damage caused by some students. The repeated damage took time and money to fix, and we have not always been able to catch the culprits to pass on the cost of repairs as the old CCTV only points at the building entrance doors.

Schools who have had similar problems found cameras in the vestibule hand wash areas proved effective in reducing poor behaviour and maintaining excellent facilities.

We have now installed cameras to hopefully have the same results; our new cameras capture the handwash areas and the stall doors, but do not intrude in the privacy of the toilet stall itself.
