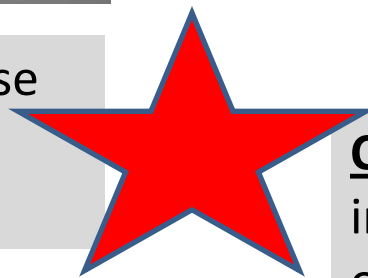
Remember to think carefully about the **ELIPSES** in the objects

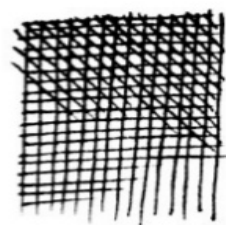
## Task 2:

You can work in pencil or biro - you choose

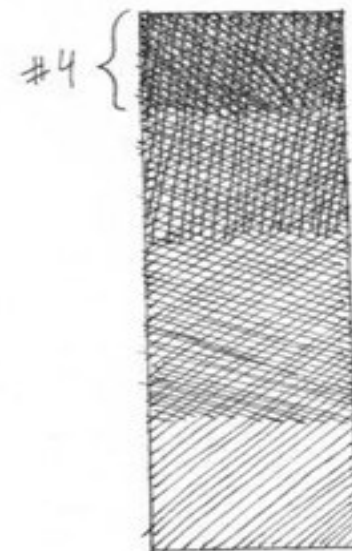
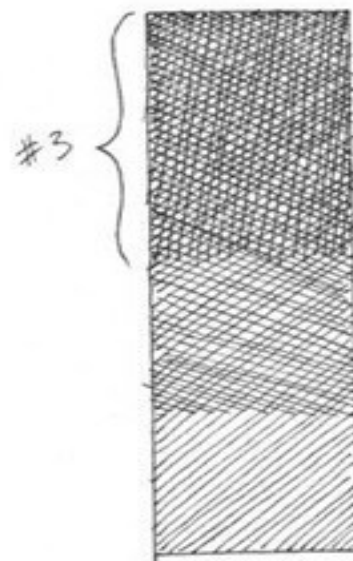
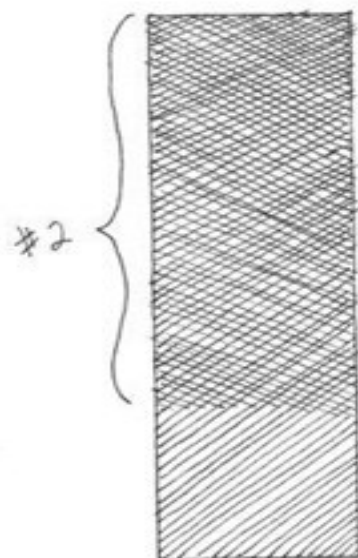
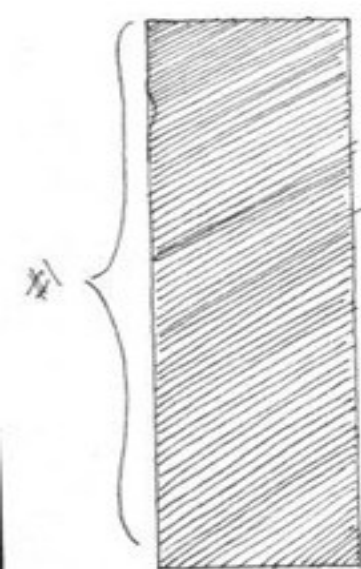

## Crosshatching



Crosshatching uses layers of hatching placed at an angle.

Usually the 1st layer is vertical, the next horizontal and the next diagonal.





Giorgio Morandi was an artist who used cross hatching excellently in his work.

Task 3:  
Now on your drawing, use **CROSS HATCHING** to shade the bottles and the background area.

Look closely at where the darkest tones are and build them up with layers of hatching and cross hatching.

### Tip

Add more cross hatching to show where shadows are

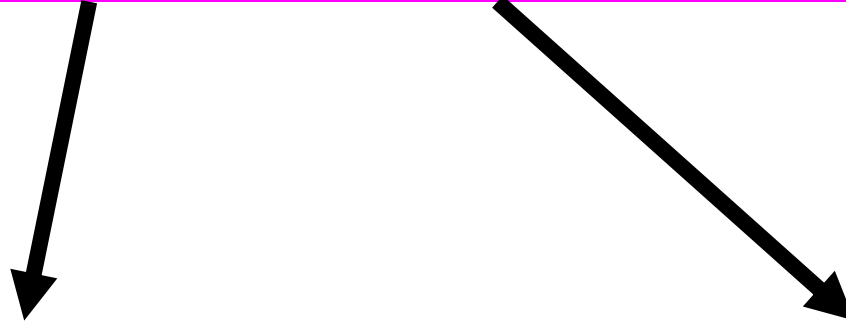

## A: Positive and Negative space in a still life



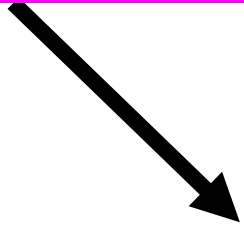


A: Positive space is where the actual objects are

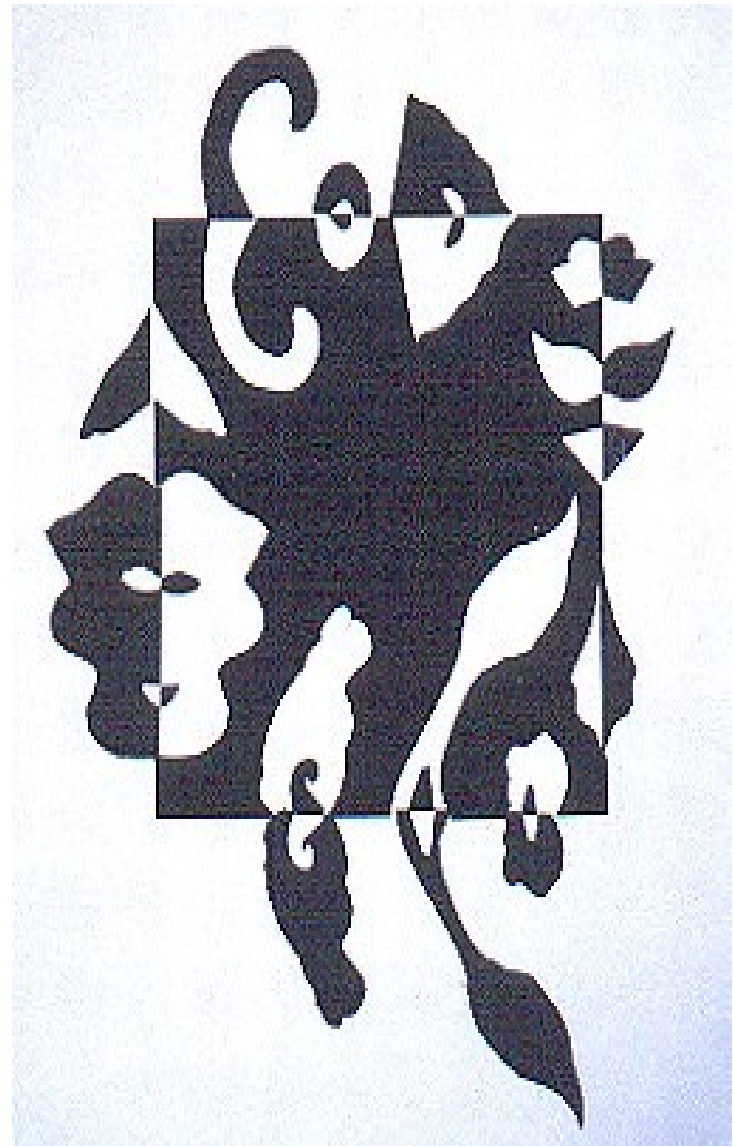
