

FARMOR'S SCHOOL UNIFORM

The KS4 Blazer, KS3 jumper and all ties are all embroidered with the Farmor's Logo. These must be bought from [Stevensons](#), or from the pre-loved shop in school (contact finance)



KS 3 Farmor's Jumper:

Blue v-neck jumper with Farmor's logo embroidered on the left breast.

KS4 Blazer:

Black jacket with Farmor's Logo
Farmor's jumper may also be worn under the blazer in cold weather.



Ties:

Clip-on ties with House coloured stripe.



Coats may be worn over the top of the uniform and not as a replacement for the jumper or blazer. They should not be worn during lessons.

'Hoodies' (a top of sweatshirt material with a hood), sweatshirts or cardigans are not considered substitutes for a

All other 'daywear' uniform is plain with no logo, these can be bought from any vendor.



Shirts

Plain white shirt with no patterns and straight collars.
Shirts should be 'tucked in'.



Trousers or Shorts:

Plain black trousers or knee length shorts.
Trousers should not be skin tight/drainpipe style.
No denim, exposed zips or large belt buckles are allowed.

Skirts:

Pleated skirt.
Skirt length should be just above, at, or below the knee.



Socks or Tights: Black

Shoes:

Plain black, flat heeled.
No trainers or canvas shoes. No prominent logos
Boots may be worn when there is snow on the ground

The following are not allowed in school for KS3 and KS4:

- ❑ Unnatural hair colours or 'extreme' hair styles (clipped hair should be no shorter than grade 1, hair accessories must be subtle and dark coloured).
- ❑ Excessive make-up
- ❑ Coloured nail varnish
- ❑ Jewellery (including rings, bracelets, necklaces, additional earrings* or any other piercings).
*One pair of small sleeper or stud earrings may be worn (one in each earlobe). These must be removed for PE lessons. New piercings should only be done at the start of the summer holidays. One charity band may be worn.
- ❑ Brightly coloured tops that show through under white shirts.
- ❑ Mobile phones which are visible and switched on during the school day (unless with the expressed permission of a teacher). Phones should be turned off and in a students bag or locker whilst in school.
- ❑ Headphones (unless in lessons with the expressed permission of a teacher).
- ❑ Speakers / portable music players
- ❑ Games consoles.

Skirt variations

Farmor's School do not insist on a supplier for non branded uniform items, allowing parents to find the most affordable option. By insisting on a common style of skirt (straight at the top then pleated) parents can still buy from their preferred supplier but we will also address the issues of very short or tight skirts on students, which we deem to be inappropriate.

Removing jumpers and blazers

Jumpers (KS3) and blazers (KS4) should be worn when students walk around the school site and when they enter classrooms for lessons. They should remain on unless the teacher has said they can be removed. If jumpers and/or blazers are removed during a lesson, they should be put back on before the student leaves the classroom.

Break and Lunchtimes

Ties, blazers and jumpers may be removed by students on the field (when it is open) during break and lunchtimes. This is to allow extra comfort for being active and playing games as well as protecting the uniform. It is the students' responsibility for keeping their uniform safe if they remove it. Students will be expected to be wearing their uniform correctly when they leave the field.

For extra warmth, KS4 students can wear the school KS3 v-neck jumper underneath their blazer. This cannot be worn as an alternative to a jacket (other jumpers are not allowed to be worn under the blazer).

Summer Uniform

During Term 6 (June and July), 'summer uniform' will be in place. During this term, students do not need to wear a blazer or jumper around the site but ties should still be worn. Alternatives to the school blazer or jumper are not permitted so students should still wear their school blazer or jumper on colder mornings.

If during Term 5 (Easter to May) the weather is particularly warm for a prolonged period of time, the school may also decide that 'summer uniform' can be worn for a designated period. If so, students and parents will be notified.

Protocol for students not wearing the correct uniform

If a pupil cannot wear their uniform to school for a good reason then a parent or carer should email their child's tutor or provide a note for them to bring in to registration.

Students who appear in incorrect uniform without a note can expect to serve a detention.

PE Kit

PE kit may be worn to school on days when a student has a PE lesson, club or fixture.

The Farmor's tracksuit is optional, but useful for students during the colder months,

Other tracksuit bottoms are allowed if they look the same (plain navy track pants—no logos).

Joggers (a hoodie type material) are not an acceptable alternative.

Plain navy or black leggings (with no logos) may be worn as a base layer under shorts

No jewellery is allowed whilst doing PE and all piercings must be removed. Defiance of this rule will result in a sanction.

Long hair must be tied back.

The team skort may be worn when playing a fixture against another school, this will be provided by the school.

Hoodies are not allowed.
