I am pleased to inform you that we have had approval to run an A Level Geographer's residential field trip to Pembrokeshire, Wales, from **Monday 18th October to Wednesday 20th October 2021**. This will provide an excellent opportunity for students to gain first-hand experience of both coastal processes and human activities in the coastal environment, which will be invaluable for the A Level examinations where all students are required to undertake fieldwork in relation to processes of both physical and human geography.

This trip usually takes place in June of Year 12 and supports student's coursework, however, we have had to delay due to COVID restrictions and students have constructed their coursework based on areas they could get to independently.
