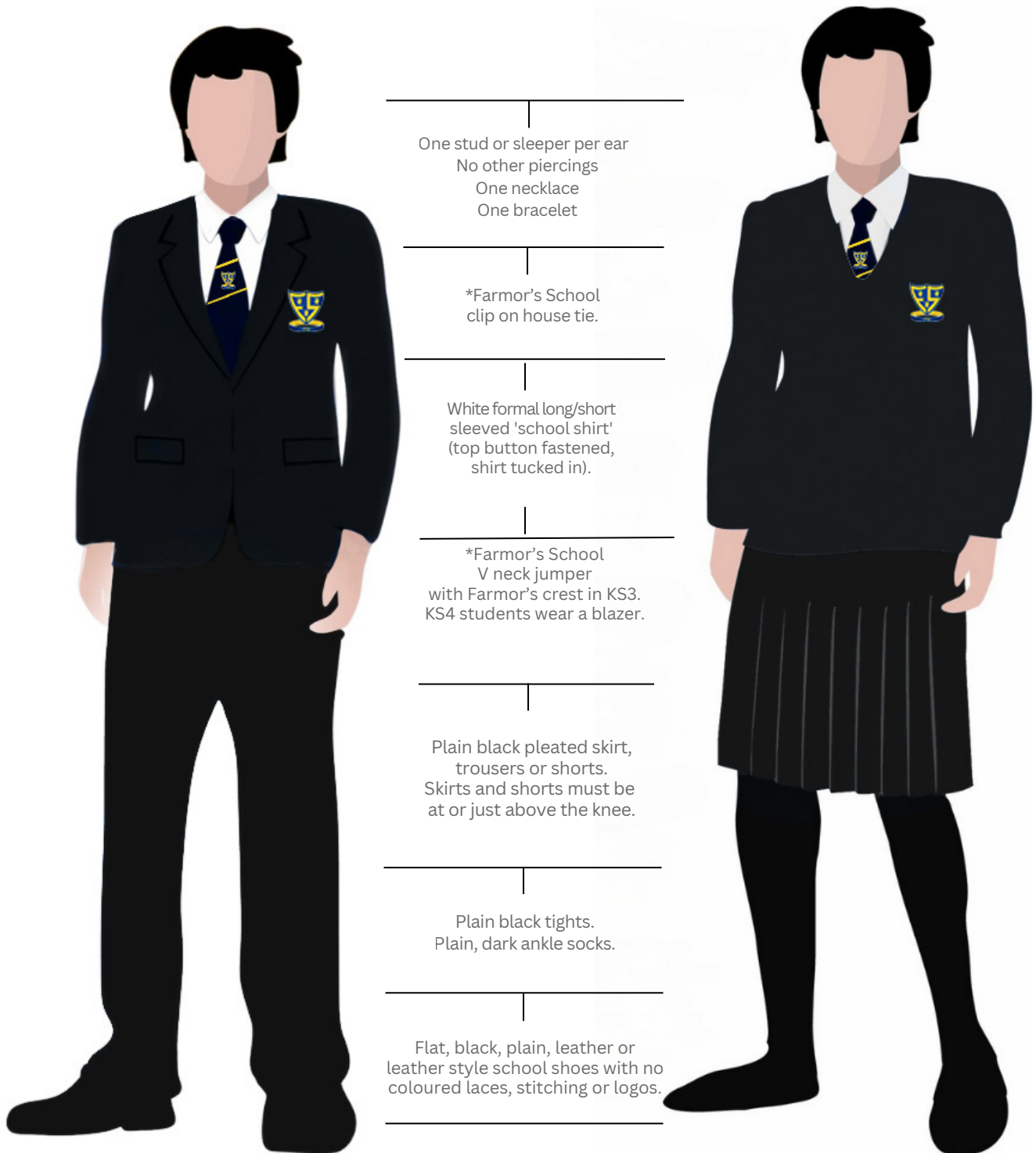




Farmor's School Daywear



One stud or sleeper per ear
No other piercings
One necklace
One bracelet

*Farmor's School
clip on house tie.

White formal long/short
sleeved 'school shirt'
(top button fastened,
shirt tucked in).

*Farmor's School
V neck jumper
with Farmor's crest in KS3.
KS4 students wear a blazer.

Plain black pleated skirt,
trousers or shorts.
Skirts and shorts must be
at or just above the knee.

Plain black tights.
Plain, dark ankle socks.

Flat, black, plain, leather or
leather style school shoes with no
coloured laces, stitching or logos.

*The KS4 blazer, KS3 jumper and ties are all embroidered with the Farmor's logo. These must be bought from [Stevensons](#), or from the pre-loved shop in school.

Farmor's School do not insist on a supplier for non-branded uniform items, allowing parents to find the most affordable option.

Plain navy shorts, or Stevenson's navy unisex/lined shorts with the school logo



Plain navy socks, or Stevenson's navy socks with gold trim.

Sports trainers and white indoor socks

These compulsory items are available from any supplier



Plain navy / black leggings and/or base layers are allowed

These optional logo-free items are available from any supplier



Plain navy tracksuit bottoms (trackpants) can be worn. No joggers or black tracksuit bottoms are allowed.

Students may wear PE kit to school if they have a PE lesson, club or fixture

Sports Trainers and white indoor socks are compulsory (from any supplier)

Other points to note:

Hoodies and Joggers (with a hoodie type material) are not allowed

No jewellery is allowed during sports, and long hair must be tied back.

A team skort may only be worn when playing a fixture against another school (this will be provided by the school)

Additional information

Coats	Coats may only be worn over the top of the uniform and not as a replacement for the jumper or blazer. They should not be worn during lessons. 'Hoodies' (a top of sweatshirt material with a hood), sweatshirts or cardigans are not considered substitutes for a coat.
Shoes	Plain black, flat heeled. No trainers or canvas shoes. No prominent logos.
Jumpers and Blazers	Jumpers (KS3) and blazers (KS4) should be worn when students walk around the school site and when they enter classrooms for lesson. Permission should be sought to remove jumpers / blazers during a lesson,;they should be put back on before the student leaves the classroom. They can be removed during break and lunch time only on the field or tennis courts (when open).
Colder weather	Students are encouraged to wear a plain base layer; bright colours that show through their white shirt are not allowed. Students in KS4 may wear the school jumper under their blazer, but not as an alternative to the blazer. Other jumpers are not an acceptable alternative to the uniform Boots may be worn instead of shoes in snowy or icy conditions
Hotter weather	During Term 6, 'summer uniform' will be in place: students need not wear their blazer or jumper around the site but ties should still be worn. Alternatives to the school blazer or jumper are not permitted so students should still wear their school blazer or jumper on colder mornings. During exceptionally hot weather, the school will communicate with parents and students to allow PE kit to be worn, or ties to be removed.
Hair colour	Hair should be a natural colour. Unnatural hair colours or 'extreme' hair styles are not permitted (clipped hair should be no shorter than grade 1). Hair accessories must be subtle and dark coloured.
Make up	Only discreet make-up is accepted.
Nails	Nail extensions, gels, acrylics and coloured nail varnish are not allowed.
Jewellery	One small sleeper or stud earrings may be worn in each earlobe. Only ears are allowed to be pierced. New piercings should only be done at the start of the summer holidays. One charity band, bracelet and necklace may be worn. Other jewellery is not allowed. All jewellery must be removed for PE lessons
